NEWS ON A COUNTRY

<u>Porridge for education program credited with higher retention rates in Isiolo, Samburu</u> and Garissa (KBC)

The 'Porridge for Education' programme has been hailed as a major game changer resulting in higher enrollment and retention of pupils. The programme is currently being piloted among learners in Grades 1, 2 and 3 in Isiolo, Samburu and Garissa by the Ministry of Education, through the National Council for Nomadic Education in Kenya (NACONEK).

Lamu Port extends special user tariffs to 2024 (The Star)

Shipping lines and traders using Lamu Port will enjoy special tariffs until May 2024 as part of Kenya Ports Authority's strategy to market the new harbour. This is in the wake of the low number of ships and cargo being handled at the facility, since its commissioning by former President Uhuru Kenyatta, in May 2021. To date, just above 20 ships have docked at Kenya's second major seaport, which the government is targeting to make it a transshipment hub.

Terror IDPs in Lamu decry government's neglect (The Star)

The Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) in Lamu County have decried being neglected by the government. For more than three months, the IDPs have been staying at Juhudi Primary School after they fled their rural homes due to increased cases of terror attacks by the al Shabaab militants in the region. At least 200 families are still pitching camp at the school in Lamu West with others reported to have migrated to urban centres where they are temporarily living.

Mandera Aims To Give Anti-Cholera Jabs To 176,000 Residents (KNA)

The Mandera County government has initiated an Oral Cholera Vaccination Campaign with the goal of reaching at least 175,575 individuals in Mandera East Sub County. Governor Mohamed Kalif stated that the vaccination campaign is in response to the ongoing cholera outbreak that has affected Mandera East for the past seven months.

Samburu County Government has initiated a relief food program targeting the most affected families (KBC Channel 1)

Samburu County Government has initiated a relief food program that targets the most affected families by the ongoing droughts.

Wajir starts solar project to address frequent power outages (The Star)

The Wajir government has started a programme to promote the use of solar energy. The county has abundant sunshine, which offers limitless potential for solar energy. The programme was launched on Thursday. Governor Ahmed Abdullahi said the time had come for the county to fully harness

solar and make it an alternative source of energy. The programme will be spearheaded by the Department of Energy and Mining.

US military conducts operations in Lamu against al Shabaab (The Star)

The US military staged a high-level military operation at Magogoni Airfield in Lamu County to counter the threat posed by al Shabaab. According to a statement issued on Saturday, the US Defense Visual Information Distribution Service (DVIDS) said the high-stakes operation was carried out jointly by the US Army and Air Force, under the 475th Expeditionary Air Base Squadron.

It aims to address severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM) cases with complications.
